Councilmember Phil Mendelson, Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary and Councilmember Carol Schwartz, Chair of the Committee on Public Works and the Environment announce a public hearing on Bill 16-666, "Litter Control Administration Amendment Act of 2006." The hearing will be held on Wednesday, June 28, 2006, at 2:30 p.m., in the 5<sup>th</sup> Floor Council Chamber of the John A. Wilson Building located at 1350 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C.

The stated purpose of Bill 16-666 is to amend the "Litter Control Administration Act of 1985" to provide that the Metropolitan Police Department and the Department of Public Works shall have the authority to issue tickets to persons violating the District's litter control laws.

The purpose of this hearing is to receive testimony from the government and the public on this bill.

Witnesses are encouraged, but not required, to bring 15 copies of their written testimony to the hearing. If submitted by the close of business on Monday, June 26, 2006, the testimony will be distributed to Councilmembers before the hearing. Individuals should limit their testimony to five minutes; less time will be allowed if there are a large number of witnesses.

If you are unable to testify at the hearing, written statements are encouraged and will be made a part of the official record.
