## **Guest Speaker for March 4, 2006**

### **Wayne Young, Publisher, Port of Harlem Magazine**

Wayne Young, publisher of the print and online ([www.portofharlem.net](http://www.portofharlem.net)) editions of Port of Harlem magazine, started the publication in 1995 as a collectible item that he gave to his Black memorabilia customers at a Black memorabilia and collectible show. The first publication featured a collection of articles that he had written for other publications ranging from the Washington Afro-American and Gary Post-Tribune newspapers to American Legacy and UpScale magazines.

He named the magazine after the world's most famous Pan-African community to reflect the magazine's inclusive, diverse, and Pan-African perspective depicted in its general interest articles. After publishing annually in black and white for the first four years and biannually for the following four, Port of Harlem is now a full-color, quarterly publication.

Port of Harlem is available at no cost at more than 175 locations in Metro Washington and Harlem. It is also available in selected cities around the country and internationally, including Gary, IN; and Jacksonville, FL USA, and Banjul, The Gambia.

Young was born and raised in Gary, Indiana and graduated from Iowa State and Roosevelt Universities. His undergraduate degree is in Construction and Small Business Management. He also holds a Masters degree in Marketing Communications.

## Free Classes on Tree Care



Casey Trees free Citizen Forester class on the Planting and Care of Trees will be offered three times in March. Participants learn to select and prepare a tree-planting site, choose an appropriate tree species for the site, and properly plant the tree to ensure survival. The class also covers the techniques critical to maintaining urban tree health, including mulching, watering, and pruning. Classes include five hours of classroom instruction and four hours of field training. An additional 20 hours of community tree planting with Casey Trees is required for Citizen Forester certification, but not required to attend the training.
