SUPERINTENDENT ALEX ROMERO Of NATIONAL CAPITAL PARKS-EAST TO SPEAK



ational Park Service (NPS)'s Superintendent of the National Capital Parks-East (NACE) Alex Romero is this month's speaker during April's Arbor Month. NPS is in the U.S. Dept. of the Interior. Romero, a 20-year veteran of the NPS, began as superintendent in July 2010.

NACE is a diverse park with natural, cultural and recreational resources that include Frederick Douglass, Carter G. Woodson, Anacostia Park, Kenilworth Aquatic Gardens, Capitol Hill Parks, Baltimore-Washington Parkway, Suitland Parkway and more.

Prior to this, he served as deputy superintendent from 2004 to 2010. Prior to NACE, he was deputy for Prince William Forest Park in Northern Virginia where he was responsible for park operations including more than 15000 acres of Piedmont Forest consisting of natural, historical and recreational facilities and the largest NPS natural area in the national capital region. Before that, he worked at the NPS in New York in similar capacities including as a public health sanitarian. A native of Long Island and Queens, NY, Romero holds a bachelor's in environmental science from SUNY Old Westbury and completed the NPS' executive Leadership Program. He enjoys hiking and physical fitness activities.

Hillcrest Loses a Giant

Remembering Dennis R. Logan March 1, 1925 to March 2, 2012



On March 2, 2012, the Hillcrest community lost a stalwart in Dennis N. Logan, who was active as chairman and co-founder of the Neighborhood Watch Program, treasurer of the Hillcrest Community Civic Association for 15 years, board member of the DC Metropolitan Boys and Girls Club, Retired DC Firefighters Association, past president of the NW Kiwanis Club DC, and the Fellowship of Retired Police and Fireman. As a member of the St. Francis Xavier Church since 1965, he served as the usher coordinator, and past president of the Holy Name Society, 3rd Degree Knights of Columbus and a founding member of the Washington Interfaith Network.

Mr. Logan was born in Rutherfordton, NC, where he attended public schools and served honorably in the Navy. In 1951, he began his

Skyland Update

The D.C. Court of Appeals recently removed restrictions, which now give the city possession of Discount Mart at the Skyland Shopping Center. This was one of the project's longest running cases. Additionally, the city was granted partial summary judgment in February on the AutoZone case; and after a June appeal by one more owner, the city will have clear title to the land, and can negotiate with developer Rappaport. The anchor tenant has already been chosen, which all but assures financing with other leases to follow.

Casey Trees, an organization that is dedicated to increasing the tree canopy in Washington, D.C., sponsors a Community Tree Planting Project where neighborhoods can have trees planted for free. This spring, Westover Drive became one of 53 Community Planting projects around the city as 14 trees

were planted at properties owned by five residents who expressed collective interest in the program. The Casey Trees team set up on Westover Drive on March 24 with a team of volunteers, and fanned out to the properties receiving new trees. The Casey Team helped homeowners select the sites, plant the trees and provided the equipment such as mulch, water bags and muscle. In return, the tree owners pledged to adhere to a multi-year watering plan, and the neighborhood provided the volunteers with lunch for the day.

"We couldn't believe our good fortune," said Alexis Simendinger, a tree recipient. "Within two hours, neighbors took possession of at least \$4,500 worth of new hollies, ginkgoes, redbuds, a cherry and several other species of trees for free. Thanks, and bravo to the hard-working urban foresters at Casey Trees."

The residents of Westover Drive have set an example for the rest of the residents of Hillcrest to follow. The Environmental Committee looks forward to accepting more tree huggers into its exclusive club. It is so wonderful to turn the corner at Pennsylvania and Branch Avenues in the summer and feel the cool and refreshing air the trees bring to our community. Yeah, I know you have felt it. Now the people who live on Westover Drive will feel it too!
