Eleanor Holmes Norton This Month's Guest Speaker



Congresswoman Eleanor Holmes Norton, now in her twelfth term as the Congresswoman for the District of Columbia, is the ranking member of the House Subcommittee on Economic Development, Public Buildings, and Emergency Management. She serves on two committees: the Committee on Oversight and Government Reform and the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.

Before her congressional service, President Jimmy Carter appointed her to serve as the first woman to chair the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission. She came to Congress as a national figure who had been a civil rights and feminist leader, tenured professor of law, and board member at three Fortune 500 companies. Congresswoman Norton has been named one of the 100 most important American women in one survey and one of the most powerful women in Washington in another. The Congresswoman's work for full congressional voting representation and for full democracy for the people of the District of Columbia continues her lifelong struggle for universal human and civil rights.

Congresswoman Norton's accomplishments in breaking barriers for her disempowered district are matched by her success in bringing home unique economic benefits to her constituents. Among them are senatorial courtesy to recommend federal judges, the U.S. Attorney, and other significant federal law enforcement positions for the District; up to \$10,000 per year for all D.C. high school graduates to attend any public U.S. college or university and up to \$2,500 per year to many private colleges and universities; a unique \$5,000 D.C. homebuyer tax credit, which has sharply increased home ownership in the District and has been a major factor in stabilizing the city's population; and D.C. business tax incentives, including a significant wage credit for employing D.C. residents, which has maintained businesses and residents in the District.

Invasive Species

Invasive species are plants, from other continent or ecosystems that were introduced into an area by humans. Unlike many plants brought to an area, these plants are considered invasive because they impact negatively the ecosystems into which they are brought.

Invasive species are aggressive growers which push out native plants, sometimes to extinction. Native plants are those which occur in a given area without human support. Plant species native to the United States were present on the continent pre - Columbus.

Some invasive species common to our area are:

- Common Daylily: This orange, yellow streaked flower gains a toe-hold in fields, meadows and moist woods; forms dense patches and displaces native species.
- Norway Maple: In forests, this tree creates a canopy of dense shade that prevents native species' seedlings from regenerating.
- Tree of Heaven: Common in urban areas, this fast grower, damages sewers, prolifically spreads its seeds, and bears a chemical that has herbicidal effects on other plants.
- English Ivy: This aggressively growing vine is a threat to all plants. On the ground, it crowds out native species plants. It climbs up tree trunks eventually reaching the leaves of trees where it prevents photosynthesis and causes the death of the invaded tree.
- Kudzu: Is a vine that is reported to grow a foot a day. It kills native plants, including trees by smothering and girdling.
- Bamboo: This woody grass forms dense thickets that push out native species and prevent native species seedlings from germinating.

You can help to prevent the spread of invasive plants species by becoming familiar with the plants and not using them.

Updating the HCCA Membership Directory

Remember, the directory will not be placed on the website or distributed in electronic format. Only printed copies will be distributed to HCCA members who'll be asked to use it only for neighborhood purposes. This information has proved invaluable in times of emergency. There will be a nominal charge for the printing of the booklet, probably in the range of \$5 to \$10.
