Backyard Wildlife Habitat Workshop

The District Department of the Environment and the Department of Parks and Recreation announce the first of a series of workshops designed to teach residents about backyard wildlife habitat and landscaping with native plants. The workshops will consist of a morning session of seminars and a site assessment, and an afternoon hands-on session where participants will help plant a demonstration garden with native beneficial plants. Participants will also receive a "habitat kit" to take home and get them started creating a wildlife habitat garden.



The workshop is scheduled for June 6, 2009, from 9:15 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. at Congress Heights Recreation Center (100 Randle Place, SE). There will be a short lunch break between the morning and afternoon sessions, and participants are encouraged to bring their own lunch. Consider a River Smart

Home—The District Department of the Environment recently launched a new program for DC residents called RiverSmart Homes. It offers incentives to homeowners interested in reducing stormwater runoff from their properties. Stormwater is rainwater, that rather than remaining on the land it falls on, flows off the land. Homeowners receive up to \$1,200 to adopt one or more of the following landscape enhancements: Shade Trees; Rain Barrels; Pervious Pavers; Rain Gardens and Bayscaping.

RiverSmart Homes will help reduce stormwater runoff, which will help the District's streams and rivers. Among the benefits of having such a home include cost savings on water, electricity, reduced heating and cooling bills; more stabilized soils, which help to prevent erosion; reducing air pollution and urban heat island effect.

HCCA Communications chair Michelle Phipps-Evans recently had an audit done by DDOE and is awaiting analysis to determine what other changes could be done to reduce stormwater runoff at the Evans' home.
