

in 2010—At HCCA's November meeting, the membership voted to increase the annual dues to \$12 starting Jan. 1, 2010. At just \$1 per month, it's still a bargain. Sorry, but it is necessary to raise dues to cover our increased expenses, including the newsletter. With that announcement comes a gentle reminder to pay your 2010 dues. Some have not yet paid 2009 dues, which were due Jan. 1, 2009. To members whose 2009 dues are not paid by Dec. 15, 2009, we will have to move you to the inactive list and hope you come back soon.

For the bargain-conscious (and who isn't?): If you pay dues before Jan. 1, 2010, the cost is still \$10. You may pay as many years ahead as you like at the \$10 rate as long as your dues are received by Jan. 1. For your convenience, you now can pay via the Internet using a credit card.
